The Red Labour Union International Week.

According to the decision of the Executive Bureau of the R.L.U.I. of Aug. 8th 1921, and to the circular note of the same bureau of Aug. 10th 1921, the "Red Labour Union International Week" will be held from December 1st to 8th 1921, for popularizing and spreading the decisions, resolutions and the program of action worked out and passed by the 1st Constituent International Congress of Revolutionary Labour Unions in Moscow.

I. Organisation.

1. In each country, a special central commission will be formed for preparing and conducting the week of the R.L.U.I.

2. The commission consists of members of the Executive Bureau and of the Central Committee of the R.L.U.I. of the resp. country, and of the representatives of the organisation centres of the revolutionary labour union minorities of the national labour organisations, which have wholly joined the Red International, of the local sections of the IIIrd International, of the Young and Women's International, and of the Invalids of War and Labour, one representative for each organisation.

3. Commissions will be equally formed in all big workers' and industry centres, which will have to carry out the program prescribed by the Central Commission.

4. The Central Commission determines to hold in that week: a. councils, conferences of the labour union representatives of the resp. country or of the resp. national group for consolidating the union of the International propaganda committees founded according to the separate branches of industry, and b. conferences and councils of the revolutionary national and International groupings.

5. The order of the day of the afore-mentioned conferences will be worked out by the central commissions of each country, especially for every conference of the separate labour unions and labour unions parties, with reference to the influence of the R.L.U.I. to the importance and the power of the revolutionary cells in the resp. industry branches or in the locality etc. in question.

6. For that week, preparations are to be made for:
a. the establishment of International solidarity-funds, b. un-

employment-funds, c. strike-funds, d. special militant-funds for regulating and managing the works kept in activity by the workers during lockouts.

II. Agitation and Propaganda.

1. In all towns and industry-centres, mass assemblies and meetings are to be held, the unemployed and the war-victims having to be drawn to participate in the meetings. The subjects for the reports in these assemblies must approach the question interesting the masses most, as for inst. 1. the present economic crisis, unemployment, the onslaught of capital, the dearth, raw materials and demand for provisions; 2. the Versailles peace, the League of Nations, the increase of armaments, the brigand aspirations of the Entente for enlarging their markets, the economic exhaustion of Central Europe, the labour movement prior to the war, during the war and after it; 3. Soviet Russia; 4. labour-cooperation, the labour bureau of the League of Nations, the Christian unions, the Amsterdam Labour Union International, the 2nd, the 2½ International, the IIIrd International, the R.L.U.I. etc.

2. Special evening meetings must be organised for reports on the history of the struggle of the working class of all times and nations, for inst. the History of the Working Class, Chartism, the Chicago events, the June days of '48, the Paris Commune, the First Russian Revolution, the 9th January, the Lena Justice of Blood, the Workers' Revolution in Russia of 1917, the English miners' struggle, Soviet Russia.

3. For that purpose, special papers, pamphlets, leaflets etc. must be published duly, and be distributed in masses among the workers.

4. Exhibitions and cinema-shows are to be organised, photographs of the leaders of the revolutionary labour unions and of episodes prominent in the labour movement must be distributed.

5. Posters and decorations must be displayed, excursions ought to be held, and plays and pageants should be produced.

The chief motto of the "Red Labour Union International Week" must be:

The united revolutionary front against the
onslaught of capital!
